This will help restore a sufficient level of confidence in Roma communities towards this kind of happenings, as many of them fear that these events are just a trap to identify and file them. More practical issues are also to be taken into account, such as how to contact Roma participants that do not have a legal address, nor an email account, or how to assure their arrival to the event (for instance through organised transportation). profile pm

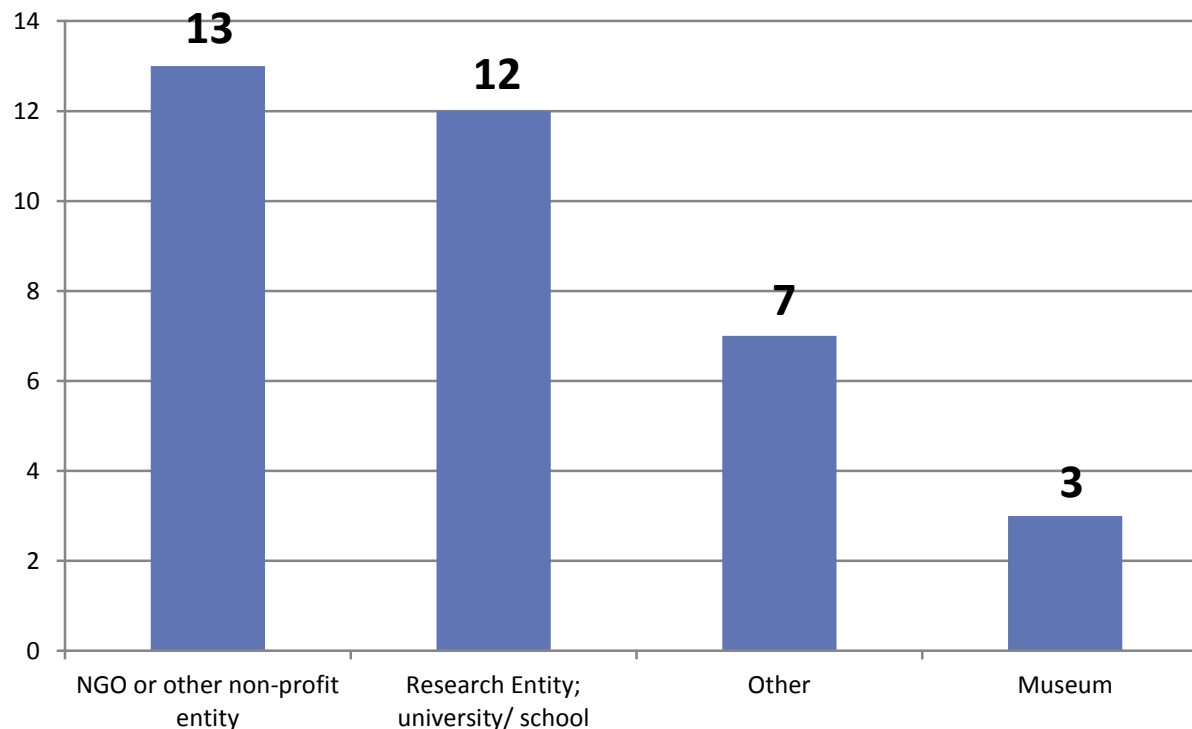

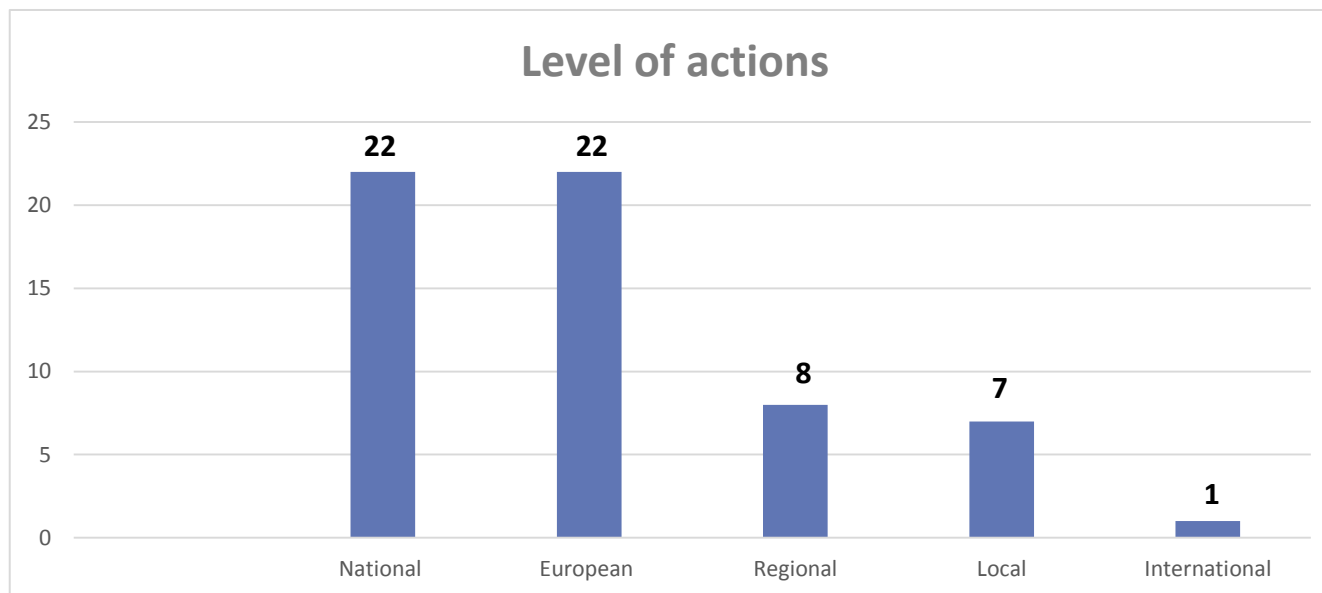
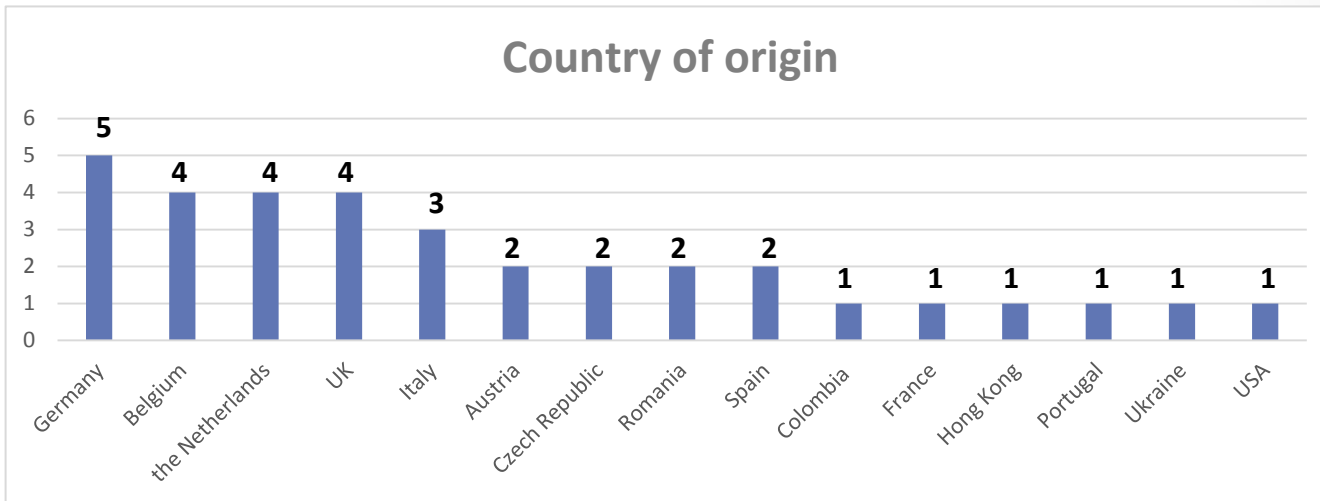
